Statement of facts:

During the 2010 Montana House District 59 campaign, candidate Joanne Blyton misrepresented State Representative Paul Beck's votes on bills presented in the State House. The statements were made at a talk given by Blyton on August 19, 2010, at the Boyd (MT) Seniors' dinner. These false statements were reported in the Carbon County News article on August 26, 2010. A copy of this article is enclosed.

Blyton's statements were:

- House Bill 246 (Montana Firearms Freedom). Blyton stated that Representative Beck voted NO; in fact, he voted YES.
- Senate Bill 327 (Protection of Mothers to Be). Blyton said that Representative Beck voted NO. This bill was never voted on because it failed in committee; Representative Beck was not on the committee and therefore did not vote on the bill.
- Senate Bill 374 (Parental Notification of Abortion). Blyton said Representative Beck voted NO. Again, this bill was never voted on because it failed in committee; Representative Beck was not on the committee.
- House Bill 590 (Benefits for Domestic Partners). Blyton stated that Representative Beck voted YES. The bill failed in committee; representative Beck was not on the committee. Note: Representative Beck voted NO on the motion on the House floor.
- Senate Bill 46 (Protection of Human Life). Blyton stated that Representative Beck voted against the bill. The bill failed in committee; representative Beck was not on the committee.

These statements by Blyton are false and discredited her campaign opponent; this dishonesty should not be allowed in a political campaign. This complaint is filed on behalf of an informal group of concerned citizens for ethical campaigns in Carbon County, Montana.

Montana religious sect leader arrested on rape charge

Authorities say the president of a Montana religious sect was arrested in Wyoming on August 19 for allegedly having sex with a 15-year-old girl.

Terrill Dalton, 43, called authorities and surrendered near Thermopolis on a warrant out of Salt Lake City charging him with two counts of first degree rape. Dalton, leader of the Holy Ghost of the Church of the Firstborn of the General Assembly of Heaven, is being held at the Hot Springs County jail.

On August 18, the U.S. Marshals Service arrested the church's 37-year-old co-leader Geody Harman in Fromberg, where the sect is

now based. He faces a charge of first degree rape and is accused of assaulting the same teen as Dalton.

Charging documents allege Harman had sex with the teen in Utah and that she told investigators another church leader encouraged her to do so because Harman was God. The documents say the girl reported having sex with Harman one time because she believed she would be blessed.

Dalton is accused of having sex with the girl after telling her that if she did so three times she would be blessed.

The church moved to Fromberg from Idaho in September after claiming

persecution. Church members initially fled to Idaho after federal agents raided their headquarters in Magna, Utah, in May 2009 to investigate claims of sexual abuse and assassination threats against President Barack Obama, former President George W. Bush and the president of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, Thomas S. Monson.

Dalton says he grew up as a Mormon but received a revelation in 2004 in which Jesus Christ called him the Holy Ghost, and said that he should start a new church.

Blyton speaks at Boyd Senior Dinner

Joanne Blyton, Republican candidate for Montana House District 59, spoke to Boyd citizens at the Boyd Senior's Dinner, Thursday, August 19. Blyton presented an issues paper for each to express concerns and priorities in local, state and national issues. Blyton is the accountant for her husband, Don's business, Billings Towing & Repair. Don Blyton is a native Montanan and Air Force veteran. After serving in the military, the Blytons pioneered a successful towing & repair business close to Washington, D.C. but husband Don's roots in Montana brought them back in 1998. Billings Towing & Repair is a multi-generation business where even Joanne's father was involved.

Blyton stated she feels Montana is her home. Her interest in Republican concerns began as a treasurer for Carbon County Republi-

cans in 2004. This year, as she saw deficit spending, unconstitutional attacks on citizens and a decay in values, she felt compelled to enter politics for the first time in her life. Blyton appreciates the difficulties all Montanans are experiencing in paying bills, raising healthy children and sharing good values with coming generations. She noted her opponent for House District 59 has consistently voted against Montana's values. He voted against Montana Authority (HR3), against Montana Firearms Freedom (HB246), against Protection of Unborn Life (SB46), against Protection of Mothers-to-be (SB327), against Parental Notification of abortion (SB374) and voted for Benefits for Domestic Partners (HB590).

After enthusiastic applause, candidate Blyton asked for questions from Boyd citizens. One citizen

asked about a new administration's measure to make lead bullets illegal. Blyton and her family are deeply committed to upholding 2nd Amendment rights.
